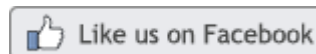

## Fire Danger this Winter

As we move further into the winter, we expect fire danger to decrease but it is still present! Unfortunately, we have seen an unusually low snow year with only 22% of average snowpack in mid December in SW Colorado and 52% of snowpack across the state. The San Juan National Forest released [a statement](#) warning of fire danger on December 13th urging residents to follow their fire prevention tips.

In November and December, there were fires in La Plata County that burned approximately 60 acres and 20 acres respectively near Electra Lake and County Roads 116 & 117. There have also been a number of ignitions from fireplace ashes being dumped into yards or left on decks and not properly stored in a metal container with lid or dumped into a bucket of water. Remember, always be aware of fire danger especially during drought conditions!

### **2017 Christmas Tree Train and SJMA Tree Lot**

Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with the Christmas Tree Train and the SJMA Tree Lot. This year, 131 christmas tree permits were sold by volunteers to remove potentially hazardous white firs from the San Juan National Forest via the Christmas Tree Train. Since these white firs were young and over populated in the areas we cut them from, the forest is not more resistant to crown fire and beetle infestation. Thank you everyone for making that possible.



The SJMA Christmas Tree Lot had their best sales day ever on our FireWise day at the lot this year. Thank you to all the volunteers who participated in the lot and to those who stopped by to get your trees. This is a great way to show our gratitude for all of SJMA's organizational support to FireWise by giving back to their conservation education programs.
